



Altar of Burnt-offering—according to Meyer.

A, the space between the boards, over which the utensils for fire and ashes were placed, while within were stones or earth; B B, the net-work grating, with the projecting ledge as described in Exod. xxvii, 4, 5; C, the *carcob* or ledge itself, projecting from the middle of the altar; D, the incline toward it on one side, for the officiating priest to ascend by formed of earth or stones; *a b c d*, the horns or corner projections of the altar.
