



**Ancient Egyptian Tunic** One of the two obtained by Gen. Reynier, when in Egypt with the French expedition, from the Arabs at Sakkarah, who said they had found them in a hole filled with sand. This is three feet square, shaped exactly like a modern shirt, but having patches of embroidery sewed upon the arms, shoulders, down the neck, and on the corners. The material is probably linen. The seams are covered with edging, the sleeves are bound, and the hole for the neck has strings for drawing it closer (*Egyptian Antiq.* ii, 119). Its resemblance to the Jewish ephod is very striking, especially if, as Josephus says (*ut sup.*), the latter had sleeves.
