



The High-priced's DRESSING-CHAIR. (From DEYER, *Dictionnaire Sacral*, p. 416-7.)

- 1. The *כִּסֵּי הַמִּזְבֵּחַ* (the *seats of the altar*), or *seats of the altar*, with its four legs, *בְּרִיבְרִיבֵי* (the *seats of the altar*), consisting the inside, *אֲחֵרֵי* (the *seats of the altar*), which are, to be high than folded down backward under.
