first husband.

= Sibylla,  
d. 1189.

= 9. Guy de Lusignan,  
second husband, loses Jerusalem  
to Saladin 1187; loses the title of  
king 1189; made king of Cyprus  
by Richard Cœur-de-Lion 1192.

= Humphrey  
de Theron,  
first husband.

third husband, appointed  
by Richard 1192; d. 1197.

8. Baldwin V.,  
d. 1186,

fourth husband,  
d. 1206.

crowned at Acre 1210;
