= 9. Guy de Lusignan,
second husband, loses Jerusalem
to Saladin 1187; loses the title of
king 1189; made king of Cyprus
by Richard Coeur-de-Lion 1192.

= Maria, daughter of Isaac Comnenus,
second wife, m. 1161.

Humphrey
de Thiron,
first husband.

10. Conrad de Montferrat,
second husband, appointed
to the title by Richard Coeur-
de-Lion 1192; assassinated 1192.

= Mary,
married John de
Brienne 1210.

11. Henri de Champagne,
third husband, appointed
by Richard 1192; d. 1231.

12. Amalric de Lusignan,
fourth husband,
d. 1260.
