



*a*, a skin hanging up in the shop, indicating the trade of leather cutter.  
*b*, cutting things out of a circular piece of skin.  
*c*, knife used for cutting things.  
*d* arranges the separate things, which are twisted by *f*, and, when finished, are bound together and hung up in the shop, *g* & *h*.  
*e*, a weight, which gives a greater impetus to the tube, *f*, when thrown round.  
*f*, collar, perforating the sole of a sandal to receive the thing.  
*g* & *h*, things ready for fixing to the sole.  
*o*, pieces of leather, ready for cutting into soles.  
*p*, an awl.
